European Regional Development Fund and Cohesion Fund (€271 billion)




Lessons from the past:

- Lack of interaction between levels of governance and ministries
- Strategies without external perspective = duplication
- Lack of or indifference to critical mass
- Measures only for R&I and capacity building and not for demand stimulation / market access
- Focus on fashionable themes / prestige projects
 - Focus on industries and not on emerging sectors and services



The S3 Platform








- Designed to assist regions and countries in developing RIS3
- Launched in June 2011
- Managed by JRC-IPTS in Seville
- Monitored by a Steering Team incl. DG REGIO, RTD, ENTR, EAC, INFSO, AGRI

Registered by Oct 2013

- + 14 EU countries
- + 2 non-EU regions

- Data from peer reviews, expert assessment reports, and national reports
- Four dimensions, short text based description, and three categories with fixed two level categories, connection to EU prioritised policies, regional capabilities and target markets.
- Not perfect matches, but an easy to use tool to give initial indications.
- Approx 100 regions and 700 priorities



Baltic sea priorities


- Data on 42 regions and 8 countries (DK only one region and Latvia o)
- 201 priorities
- Common categories are:
 - Sustainability (37) and Energy (22 – renewable 13)
 - ICT and Digital Agenda (25)
 - Health (24)
 - Tourism and experience based economy (21 priorities)
 - Agriculture and Food (13)
 - Transport (14)

 - Northern Ostrobotnia (FI)






