## **Prescription & adherence to medical plans**

#### Commitments

- Create IT system for monitoring elderly patients' medicaments intake, along with the integration with sensor
- Validate tools to assess appropriateness of the prescribed medicine & assist the assessment of adherence: adherence control
- Facilitate the prescription until the next visit this will require linkage with the community pharmacist
- Facilitate communication with other health professionals: nurses, other doctors, pharmacists – also between primary and secondary care




## **Prevention of functional decline & frailty**

- Supporting healthcare professionals in the development and application of efficient and suitable care in or close to the home and the daily life context






## ICT and Teleservices Defining services & pooling on-going efforts





The first signs that such innovations meet the ambitions of the **triple win** 

#### Community Assessment of Risk and Treatment Strategies Programme in Ireland (IE)

originated in two suburbs in Cork city and expanded regionally to Counties Cork and Kerry

adopted as screening tool in two other EIP members: University of Porto (PT) and Northern Health & Social Care Trust of N. Ireland

#### Euregional Network for Patient Safety and Infection Prevention in Northern Netherlands (NL)

started in one single region in the Dutch-German border and enlarged to all 5 regions in the Dutch-German border

#### Holistic health and social services at home in Valencia (ES)

started in Hospital La Fe and then scaled up to all the Units in the region

transferred and used by the Hospital Marqués de Valdecilla in Santander (another region)



# **Reference sites – the way forward**

### Communication and dissemination

<u>Key elements</u>: assessment feedback of good practices, translation of main findings into national languages, involvement of local and national authorities, engagement with business and local partners

### Networking and coaching

<u>Key elements:</u> active "twinning", comparative framework, identification of success parameters and transferable elements




7th Framework Programme (FP7): More than  $\in$  4 billion available in the last calls (July 2012) potentially relevant for societal challenge such as ageing and/or EIP priorities.

Competitiveness and Innovation Framework Programme (CIP): ICT part of CIP allocated €24 Million in the Work Programme 2012 for actions directly relevant for the EIP. €39 Million in 2013

Second Health Programmes: In 2012 call,  $\in$  4 million for the EIP on AHA. In 2013  $\in$ 6 Million and a Joint Action on Chronic Diseases and promoting Healthy Ageing ( $\in$ 5 Million).
